SAFETY CORNER



Safety Corner

Welcome back to Safety Corner, where this month we will be discussing bicycle safety. Summer is now in full swing and the kids are out of school. Which means it's the perfect time to ride! But do your kids and young adults know the proper road rules and safety signals?

If not, we're here to help! The following graphics show the proper hand signals for cyclists to use on the road. Whether riding in town or out in the sticks!

Make sure your children know the basic hand signs for cyclists, used to communicate with vehicular drivers on the road! Have a look at the image below and explain what each hand gesture means with your children.

This will provide an extra layer of safety while they ride and will ensure no surprises for drivers!

Do your kids know what road signs mean? Have a look at the signs you'll find on the road (shown below and in the right hand column) to explain their meanings and the rules of them - which even children must obey, while riding their bike.



What about children riding bikes on the sidewalk? Is this allowed?

Ontario Traffic Law states:

"Children under 10 can ride on the sidewalk until they develop the skills to ride on the road with traffic."

If the road is too busy for a child older than ten to ride, it's best an adult accompany them, or they abstain from riding that route until they are ready.



Bicycles are allowed on this roadway.



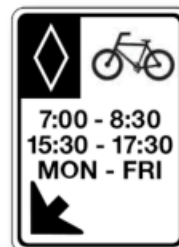
Bicycles are not allowed on this roadway.



Cyclists must walk their bicycles on this roadway.



Only bicycles are permitted to use this lane.



Bicycles are permitted in this lane during specified hours.



Bicycles must share the pathway with pedestrians.

Remember – it's better to be safe than sorry, and teaching your kids these simple signs and rules of the road is just another thing you can do to keep your loved ones safe while enjoying some healthy exercise!



Stop and wait until the roadway is clear to enter. Everyone, including cyclists, must wait until everyone with the right of way has made passage before entering the lane.



A railway crossing is ahead and meets the road at the angle shown.



There is roadwork underway ahead, pay close attention for workers and changing road conditions.



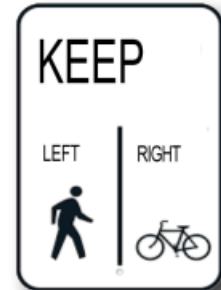
Do not enter the lane until all traffic passes and the lane is clear. You do not have the right of way and must yield to all traffic before entering the lane.



Traffic flows one way in this lane, only in the specific direction shown. Do not enter this lane if you are not travelling in the direction indicated.



Cyclists must keep their bicycles to the left of the path indicated.



Cyclists must keep their bicycles to the right of the path indicated.



The bicycle lane ends where this sign appears.



Cyclists must yield the indicated lane to crossing pedestrians.

Rules of the Road



A solid or blinking green light or left-pointing arrow permits you to turn left, go straight ahead or turn from the proper lane.

Flashing yellow lights signal drivers to slow down and proceed with caution through the intersection as the light will be turning red shortly.

Solid and red lights signal for drivers to bring their vehicles to a stop. Flashing red lights signal traffic to stop and proceed through the intersection only when it is safe to do so.

Similar to regular traffic signal lights, bicycle traffic signal lights direct cycling traffic at intersections.

If both a bicycle traffic signal and a regular traffic signal apply to the same lane, cyclists in that lane must obey the bicycle traffic signal.

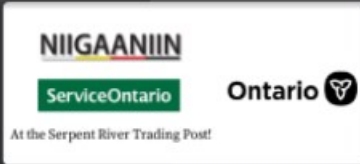

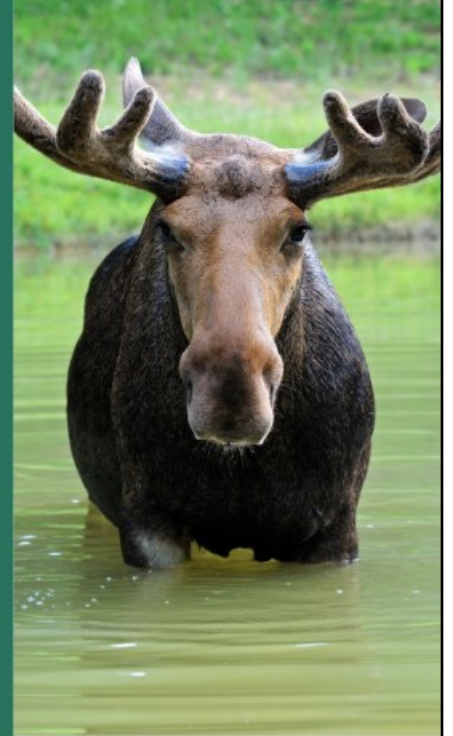
